


Calabash Elks donate to LifeCare

The VAC hosted a Veterans Recognition Luncheon in February honoring Veterans in our area but not members of the Lodge. These included presenting Congressional Memorial coins to our Vietnam Era Veterans, presenting certificates and US Flag/Elk Flag pins recognizing their service to our Nation, sharing in each Veteran's recollection of the high points of their service.

The VAC made a \$1000.00 donation to the American Legion Post 68 **BE-THE-ONE** Program. The mission of the **BE-THE-ONE** Program is to assist Veterans, their families, care givers, friends or interested civilians to: Destignatize the asking for mental health support; Provide peer-to-peer support and resources in local communities; Deploy FDA approved therapeutics for veterans to identify issues and find resources for support; and the Education of everyone on how they can Bethe-One to address the number 1 issue facing the veteran community - Suicide. With that Veterans are encouraged to **Be-the-One** to: Talk with others about how they are feeling; Ask for help when you know you need it; Know there are people ready to help them; Remember family and friends' care. Also, Family, friends, or associates are encouraged to Be-the-One to: Ask Veterans in your life how they are doing; Listen when a Veteran needs to talk; Reach out when a veteran is struggling

The VAC made a \$2000.00 donation to the Brunswick Community College's (BCC) Partnership for American Veteran Employment (PAVE) Program. The mission of the **PAVE** Program is to support an institutional work/study program that provides the Veteran students real-life experiences in the civilian work place through employment at BCC, which then may increase their marketability in the workplace upon graduation. Many Veterans are able to attend Brunswick Community College due to the GI Bill. However, they may need additional resources to supplement their living expenses, and require seeking employment, that may conflict with their educational program requirements.




The donations to PAVE program are earmarked to minimize stress for our Veterans through the funding of the institutional work study program. Since the initiation of the PAVE Program in 2016, the Veteran's Affairs Committee of the Benevolent Protective Order of Elks, Lodge ~ 2679 has donated \$10,000.00.




The VAC received an Elks National Foundation (ERF) Beacon Grant for \$4,000 in December. This money makes use of the ENF donations coming from our Lodge members—THANK You. We used the funds to continue our support for the Veterans Welcome Home and Resource Center (VWHRC) that supports our Veterans in many ways, one of which is the Tiny Home Village for homeless veterans. After the November opening of the VWHRC's Tiny Home Village consisting of 25 homes, the VAC worked with them to identify additional support needed to improve living conditions in the Tiny Homes. Working with the Center, the VAC has compiled a "needed" list of items to support the homes for incoming homeless Veterans. VAC members handled the acquisition and payment for the items that included closet shelves, small crock pot-like food warmers, sheets, hangers, and alarm clocks valued at over \$4,500. VAC teams then delivered the items, helped distribute them to the homes, and installed the closet shelving on walls in each of the Tiny Homes. As a follow up to this Beacon Grant project, VAC members are working with the Center to identify items veterans newly moving into the Tiny Homes will need. We anticipate that these items would be procured under the ENF Welcome Home Kit program.



I myself would choose a Ricky burger any day. He prefers to make a burger that you have to eat with both hands!




